It appearing from said verified petition and from the files herein that Harvey England died intestate in Tooele County, Utah, on November 2, 1951, leaving surviving him his spouse, Mildred G. England and a daughter Carol England, and

It appearing that Mildred G. England was duly appointed and qualified as administratrix herein pursuant to the order of this court, dated September 8, 1952, and that she has duly filed an inventory of the estate of the deceased herein and said inventory and appraisement is in due form and according to law, and

It further appearing that notice to creditors has been duly published, pursuant to law, in The Transcript-Bulletin, a newspaper of general circulation in Tooele County, State of Utah, in that thoo for publication of such notice to creditors has been and and that this court has made and entered its order show-

It further appearing that all of the taxes of the estate of aid and the tall expenses of the last illness and expenses in the true burial of the deceased have been paid and the second inheritance taxes due from this estate as appears to the paid of the said tax commission, the contact of the said tax commission, appearing that it was necessary for the petitioner to

\$2,083.00 and that such sale was for the benefit of the estate and that the petitioner executed a release of contract with Howard Whitehouse of Tooele, Utah, and that said mutual release was for the best interests of the estate and petitioner having filed her first and final account in due form and according to law, and said account being supported by vouchers, and

It appearing that the sum of \$420.00 has been expended for attorney fees and said amount appearing to be reasonable and proper for the payment of the attorney's fees for services herein, and

\$280.00 for administratrix' fee pursuant to the provisions of Section 75-11-28, Utah Code Annotated, 1953, but that there is no cash available for distribution after the payment of all costs and fees herein, and

It appearing that all of the actions of the administratrix herein are according to law, and

It appearing that due and legal notice has been given of the filing of the petition herein,

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED as follows:

- 3. That it is ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that the heirs at law of the deceased, Harvey England, are Mildred G. England, also known as Mildred G. Coon, his surviving spouse, and Carol England, his surviving daughter, and that said heirs are

entitled to receive as their respective shares of the estate of the deceased herein one-half each. That the known estate of the deceased consists of the following property:

Real Property

Beginning at a point which is 20 chains East and 22.47 chains South from the Northwest corner of Block four, in Plat "B" of the Tooele City Survey, and running thence East seventy-five feet; thence North one hundred fifty feet; thence West seventy-five feet; thence South one hundred fifty feet to the place of beginning, containing one-fourth acre of land, more or less, in Tooele County, Utah.
