WHEREAS, ALONZO J. STOOKEY of Clover, of the County of Tooele, State of Utah, heretofore purchased from the State of Utah, the lands hereinafter described, pursuant to the laws of said State in such case made and provided.

AND WHEREAS, the said ALONZO J. STOOKEY has paid for said lands, pursuant to the conditions of said sale, and the laws of the State duly enacted in relation thereto, the sum of SEVENTEEN HUNDRED FIFTY EIGHT AND 80/100 (\$1758.80) Dollars, and all legal interest thereon accrued, as fully appears by the certificate of the proper officer, now on file in the office of the Secretary of State of the State of Utah;

NOW THEREFORE, I HARDEN BENNION, Acting Governor, in consideration of the premises, and by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the laws of the State of Utah, in such case made and provided, do issue this PATENT, in the name and by the authority of the State of Utah, hereby granting and confirming unto the said ALONZO J. STOOKEY and to his heirs and assigns forever, the following piece or parcel of land, situated in the County of Tooele State aforesaid, to-wit: Lots one (1), Two (2) and three (3); the south half ($S\frac{1}{2}$) of the North-east quarter ($NE\frac{1}{4}$); the Southeast quarter ($SE\frac{1}{4}$) and the East Half ($E\frac{1}{2}$) of the Southwest quarter ($SW\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Two (2) in Township Four (4) South, Range Six (6) West of the Salt Lake Meridian. containing Four Hundred Thirty Nine and 70/100 (\$439.70) acres according to the said certificate,
