The United States of America, To all to whom these presents shall come, greeting:

Whereas, In pursuance of the provisions of the Revised Statutes  
of the United States, Chapter Six, Title Thirty-two, and legislation sup-  
plemental thereto, there has been deposited in the General Land Office  
of the United States the certificate, No. 1930, of the Register of the  
Land Office at Salt Lake City, in the Territory of Utah, accom-  
panied by other evidence, whereby it appears that Frank H. Peyton  
S. & F. Frank did, on the twenty-seventh day of March, A.D. 1893,  
duly enter and pay for that certain placer mining claim and  
premises known as the Consolidated Hot Spring & many placer  
mining claim, and described as the

West half of the Southwest quarter of the Southwest quarter,  
the West half of the Northwest quarter of the Southwest quarter,

the West half of the East half of the North west quarter of the South west quarter, and the West half of the East half of the South west quarter of the South west quarter of Section twelve, in Township one North of Range one West Salt Lake Meridian, situate in the Bountiful mining district, Davis County, Utah, and containing sixty acres of land, more or less.

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore hereby granted by the United States unto the said Frank H. Peyton and S. V. Trent and to their heirs and assigns, the said place or mining premises hereinbefore described,

To Have and to Hold said mining premises, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature therunto belonging unto the said grantees above named and to their heirs and assigns forever; subject nevertheless to the following conditions and stipulations:

First. That the grant hereby made is restricted in its exterior limits to the boundaries of the said mining premises, and to any vein or lode of quartz or other rock in place bearing gold, silver, cinnamon, lead, tin, copper, or other valuable deposits, which may have been discovered within said limits subsequent to and which were not known to exist on the twenty sixth day of August, A.D. one thousand eight hundred and ninety.

Second. That should any vein or lode of quartz or other rock in place bearing gold, silver, cinnamon, lead, tin, copper, or other valuable deposits, be claimed or known to exist within the above described premises at said last named date, the same is expressly excepted and excluded from these grants.

Third. That the premises hereby conveyed may be entered by the proprietor of any vein or lode of quartz or other rock in place bearing gold, silver, cinnamon, lead, tin, copper, or other valuable deposits, for the purpose of extracting and removing the ore from such vein or lode, should the same or any part thereof, be found to penetrate, intersect, pass through, or dip into the mining ground or premises hereby granted.

Fourth. That the premises hereby conveyed shall be held subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local laws, customs, and decisions of courts. And there is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right of way.

therum for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.  
Fifth. That in the absence of necessary legislation by Congress, the Legislature of Utah may provide rules for working the mining claim or premises hereby granted, making easements, drainage, and other necessary means to the complete development thereof.

In Testimony Whereof, I, Grover Cleveland President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
