## The United States of America.

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:  
Certificate

No 1, 155. Whereas William Eddington Mayor of Morgan City, Morgan County, Utah Territory, in Trust for the several use and benefit of the inhabitants of said city, in said County and Territory according to their respective interests, by virtue of the act of March 2<sup>d</sup> 1867 Entitled an act for the relief of the inhabitants of cities and Towns upon the Public Lands, was deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the register of the Land office of Salt Lake City Utah Territory, whereby it appears, that full payment has been made by the said William Eddington, Mayor as aforesaid, in Trust as aforesaid, according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the Twenty fourth of April 1820, Entitled "an act making further provision for the sale of the public Lands" for the North East quarter, the North West quarter, and the South West quarter of section thirty six, the South West quarter of section twenty five, the ~~of Range two East~~ South half of the North East quarter, and the South East quarter of section thirty five, in Township four North, Range two East, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Salt Lake City, Utah Territory, containing Eight hundred and eighty acres, according to the official plat, of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the general Land office of the surveyor General which said tracts have been purchased by the said William Eddington, Mayor as aforesaid, in Trust as aforesaid.

Now Know ye, that the United States of America in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said William

Eddington, Mayor as aforesaid, in Trust as aforesaid, and to his successors, the said Tract above described, to have and to hold, the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said William Eddington Mayor, as aforesaid, in Trust as aforesaid (No title shall hereby be acquired, to any mine of Gold silver cinnabar or copper, or to any valid mining claim or possession held under existing laws of Congress and to his successors and assigns in Trust as aforesaid.)

In Testimony Whereof I Ulysses S Grant President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made patent and the seal of the General Land Office, to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand at the City of Washington the Twenty-fifth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy six, and of the independence of the United States, the one hundredth.
