NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, HAS GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DOES GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said Folke A. Myrin and Katherine H. Myrin and to their heirs the Land above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Folke A. Myrin and Katherine H. Myrin and to their heirs and assigns forever.

Reserving, however, to the United States in trust, all oil, gas, hydrocarbons, and all other minerals and mineral rights, under or underlying the above described lands, and the right to entry for mining and drilling, and a right of entry to prospect for, mine, develop, extract and remove such minerals or mineral substances, for the benefit of the Ute Indian Tribe of the Uintah and Ouray Reservation, Utah, under Section 5 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat., 984), and subject to the right of compensation to the surface owners and (or) parties lawfully in possession of the surface estate, for any damage to growing crops, emblements and improvements resulting from said entry for oil, gas or other mineral purposes.
