# The United States of America,

Do all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Salt Lake City, Utah,

has been deposited in the General Land Office, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress of May 20, 1862,

"to Secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, including the Act of February 7, 1925 (43 Stat. 809) the claim of Adolph Hafan

has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the Lot five of Section twenty-one, the Lots one, two, three, four, seven and eight and the southeast quarter of the northwest quarter of Section twenty-seven, the Lot one, the south half of the northeast quarter and the southeast quarter of Section twenty-eight and the north half of the northwest quarter of Section thirty-four in Township forty-two south of Range sixteen west of the Salt Lake Meridian, Utah, containing six hundred thirty-nine acres and twelve hundredths of an acre,

NOW KNOW YE that there is, therefore, granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said claimant TO HAVE AND TO HOLD unto the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said claimant and his heirs and assigns of the lawful inheritance of the said claimant, subject to any vested and accrued water rights that may be recognized and acknowledged by the laws of the State of Utah, and to any water rights and appurtenances that may be recognized and acknowledged by the laws of the State of Idaho, and to any water rights and appurtenances that may be recognized and acknowledged by the laws of the State of Nevada, and to any water rights and appurtenances that may be recognized and acknowledged by the laws of the State of California, and to any water rights and appurtenances that may be recognized and acknowledged by the laws of the State of Arizona, and to any water rights and appurtenances that may be recognized and acknowledged by the laws of the State of New Mexico, and to any water rights and appurtenances that may be recognized and acknowledged by the laws of the State of Colorado, and there is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right of way through for ditches and canals constructed by the authority of the United States. Excepting and reserving, however, to the United States all the coal and other minerals in the lands so entered and patented, together with the right to prospect for, mine, and remove the same pursuant to the provisions and limitations of the Act of December 29, 1916 (39 Stat., 862).
