Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Salt Lake City, Utah Territory, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Joseph Burrows has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the south east quarter of the north west quarter the north east quarter of the south west quarter, and the lots numbered five and six of section six in township six north of range two east of Salt Lake Meridian in Utah Territory, containing one hundred and fifty eight acres and ninety one hundredths of an acre according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now know ye, that there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said Joseph Burrows the tract of land above described: To have and to hold, the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Joseph Burrows and to his heirs and assigns forever;

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subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws, and decisions of courts, and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to extract and remove his ore therefrom should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted, as provided by law.

In Testimony Whereof, I, Benjamin Harrison, President of the United States of America have caused these letters to be made Patent and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereinto affixed.
