twenty two east of Salt Lake Meridian in Utah, Territory, containing one hundred  
and sixth acres, according to the official plat of the survey of the said land, returned  
to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the Surveyor General;

Now know ye, that there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said John D. Karren the tract of land above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said John D. Karren, and to his heirs and assigns forever; subject thereto to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights for ditches reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws, and decisions of courts, and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to extract his ore therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the the premises hereby granted, as provided by law.
