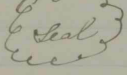

Kullinger according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands, and the acts supplemental thereto, for the West half of the South East quarter and the East half of the South West quarter of Section fourteen in Township five South of Range twenty two East of Salt Lake Meridian in Utah Territory, containing one hundred and sixty acres according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Harry C. Kullinger Now know ye

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That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Harvey C.
