DECLARATION OF COVENANTS, CONDITIONS, AND RESTRICTIONS FOR

RECITALS

- A. Declarant is the "Declarant" named in the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions for Cottages at the Village at Stucki Farms, recorded December 14, 2018, as Doc. No. 20180049361, in the files of the Washington County Recorder (hereafter the "Prior Declaration").
- B. Declarant desires to amend and completely restate the Prior Declaration, as authorized in Article VIII thereof, to address certain requirements and provisions applicable to the use of Units as short-term rentals.
- C. With this Declaration, Declarant desires to provide for preservation and enhancement of the property values and amenities of the Property and for maintenance of the Common Areas. To this end and for the benefit of the Property and of the Owners thereof, Declarant desires to subject the properties described in Exhibit "A" to the covenants, restrictions, easements, charges, and liens hereinafter set forth, each and all of which are for the benefit of the Property and each Owner thereof.

DECLARATION

Declarant declares that all of the Property described herein shall be held, sold, and conveyed subject to the following easements, restrictions, covenants, conditions, reservations, assessments, charges, and liens, and to the Plat Map recorded December 14, 2018, as Doc. No. 20180049360 in the files of the Washington County Recorder. This is for the purpose of protecting the value and desirability of said Property. This Declaration and the Official Plat shall be construed as covenants

of equitable servitude which shall run with the land and shall be binding on all parties having any right, title or interest in the described property or any part thereof, their heirs, successors and assigns, and shall inure to the benefit of each Owner thereof.

The Property is located in the City of Washington, Washington County, State of Utah, and is more particularly described as set forth in Exhibit "A" hereto.

ARTICLE I **PROPERTY RIGHTS**

- Section 1. Definition of "Unit." For purposes of this Declaration, "Unit" shall mean and refer to each of the parcels of land described by the Official Plat which are intended for, or upon which has been constructed, a residential dwelling. "Unit" shall not mean any parcel of land which is intended or utilized for any other purpose, including commercial purposes or for improvement for amenities to benefit the community.
- Section 2. Owners' Easements of Enjoyment to Common Areas. Every Unit Owner shall have a right and easement of use and enjoyment including, but not limited to, the right of ingress and egress to and from his Unit and in and to the Common Areas, which easement is appurtenant to and passes with title to every Unit.
- Section 3. Owners' Easements of Enjoyment to Limited Common Areas. Each Unit Owner is hereby granted an irrevocable and exclusive license to use and occupy the Limited Common Areas appurtenant to certain Units and identified on the Official Plat of the Project. The exclusive right to use and occupy such Limited Common Areas shall be appurtenant to and shall pass with the title to every Unit with which it is associated. A Unit Owner's exclusive right of use and occupancy of Limited Common Areas reserved for their Unit shall be subject to and in accordance with the Declaration and Bylaws.
- Section 4. Master Declaration and Creation of Master Association. The Declarant reserve the right to record against the Property and other properties in the Stucki Farms community a master declaration of covenants, conditions and restrictions (the "Master Declaration"), which shall, among other things, establish a master homeowners' association for the Stucki Farms community, to be known as the Stucki Farms Master Owners Association, Inc. (the "Master Association").

ARTICLE II MEMBERSHIP AND VOTING RIGHTS

Section 1. Membership. Every Owner of a Unit which is subject to assessment shall be a Member of the neighborhood homeowners' association to be known as The Cottages at the Village at Stucki Farms Homeowners Association (hereafter the "Association"). Membership shall be appurtenant to and may not be separated from ownership of any Unit which is subject to assessment.

Owners of parcels not meeting the definition of "Unit" shall not be Members of the Association, and said parcels shall not be subject to assessment hereunder.

- Section 2. Board of Directors. The Board of Directors shall initially consist of three (3) members. Declarant reserves the right to appoint the Board of Directors and to exercise all powers and responsibilities associated with the Board of Directors during the Declarant Control Period.
- Section 3. Classes of Membership. The Association shall have two (2) classes of membership:
 - (a) <u>Class A.</u> Class A Members shall be all Owners, with the exception of Declarant, and shall be entitled to one (1) vote for each Unit owned.
 - (b) <u>Class B</u>. The Class B Member shall be Declarant and shall be entitled to five (5) votes for each Unit owned. Class B membership shall cease and be converted to Class A membership on the date which is ninety (90) days after the Declarant no longer owns or controls any of the Units, or any part thereof, for purposes of development. The period of time prior to said date shall be referred to as the "Declarant Control Period."
 - (c) <u>Multiple Ownership Interests</u>. In the event there is more than one (1) Owner of a particular Unit, the vote relating to such Unit shall be exercised as such Owners may determine among themselves. A vote cast at any Association meeting by any such Owner, whether in person or by proxy, shall be conclusively presumed to be the vote attributable to the Unit concerned unless an objection is immediately made by another Owner of the same Unit. In the event such an objection is made, the vote involved shall not be counted for any purpose whatsoever other than to determine whether a quorum exists.
- Section 4. Membership in and Election of Director of Master Association. It is anticipated that every Owner shall also be a member of the Master Association. The board of directors of the Master Association will be comprised of one (1) director from or representing the Association and each other neighborhood association in the Stucki Farms community, as set forth in the bylaws of the Master Association. The person who will represent the Association on the Master Association board shall be elected or appointed as set forth in the governing documents of the Master Association.

ARTICLE III COVENANT FOR MAINTENANCE ASSESSMENTS

Section 1. Creation of Lien and Personal Obligation of Assessments. Declarant (as applicable) and Members, for each Unit owned within the Property, hereby covenant, and each Owner of any Unit by acceptance of a deed therefor, whether or not it shall be so expressed in such Deed, is deemed to covenant and agree to pay to the Association (i) annual assessments, (ii) special

assessments, and (iii) additional assessments as set forth in this Declaration or as provided by law. Assessments shall be levied, fixed, established and collected from time to time. The assessments, together with interest, costs and reasonable attorney fees, shall be a charge on the land and shall be a continuing lien upon the Unit against which each such assessment is made. Each such assessment, together with interest, costs and reasonable attorney fees, shall also be the personal obligation of the person who was the Owner of such Unit at the time the assessment became due. The personal obligation for delinquent assessments shall not pass to his successors in title unless expressly assumed by them. Notwithstanding any assessment obligation otherwise described in this section, Declarant shall pay no assessment (annual, special or additional) unless a Unit owned by Declarant is constructed on a Unit.

Section 2. Purpose of Assessments. Assessments levied by the Association shall be used to pay the common expenses of the Association, including for the purpose of maintaining the common areas and facilities, and promoting the maintenance, health, safety, and welfare of residents of the Property. The use made by the Association of funds obtained from assessments may include payment of the cost of taxes and insurance on the Common Areas; management and supervision of the Common Areas, including personal property owned by the Association; repair and maintenance of the Common Areas; funding the purchase of (i) personal property to be used by Association Members, and (ii) adjacent land to be used as Common Areas; establishing and funding a reserve to cover the repair or replacement of improvements within the Common Areas; and any expense necessary or desirable to enable the Association to perform or fulfill its obligations, functions, or purposes under this Declaration or its Articles of Incorporation.

Section 3. Subordination of Lien to Mortgages. The lien created hereunder upon any Unit shall be subject and subordinate to and shall not affect the rights of the holder of the indebtedness secured by any first mortgage (meaning a mortgage with first priority over other mortgages) or equivalent security interest on any Unit, made in good faith and for value, recorded prior to the date any such assessment becomes due. Any holder of a first mortgage lien or equivalent security interest on a Unit who comes into possession by virtue of foreclosure of a mortgage, or by deed or assignment in lieu of foreclosure, or any purchaser at a foreclosure sale will take said Unit and the improvements appurtenant thereto free of any claims for unpaid assessment charges against said Unit which accrue prior to the time such holder comes into possession of the Unit, except for the claims for a share of such expenses or charge resulting from a reallocation of such assessment or charges to all Units including the mortgaged Unit. Any first mortgagee, who obtains title to a Unit in the development pursuant to the remedies in the mortgage/deed of trust or through foreclosure of the mortgage/deed of trust or any other security instrument, shall not be liable for more than six (6) months of the Unit's unpaid dues or charges which have accrued before the acquisition of title to the Unit by the mortgagee through foreclosure. However, no such sale or transfer shall relieve such Unit from liability for any assessments which thereafter become due or from the lien thereof.

<u>Section 4.</u> <u>Exempt Property.</u> The following property subject to this Declaration shall be exempt from the assessments created herein:

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- (a) All Properties dedicated to and accepted by any local public authority;
- (b) The Common Areas; and
- (c) Units owned by Declarant, except for Units owned by Declarant on which a unit is constructed; and
 - (d) Any Properties not meeting the definition of "Unit" hereunder.
- Section 5. Additional Assessments. In addition to the annual assessments and special assessments for capital improvements authorized herein, the Association shall levy such assessments as may be necessary from time to time for the purpose of repairing and restoring the damage or disruption resulting to the streets or other Common Areas or Limited Common Areas from the activities of the City of Washington in maintaining, repairing or replacing utility lines and facilities thereon, it being acknowledged that the ownership of utility lines, underground or otherwise, is in the City up to and including the meters for individual Units, and that they are installed and shall be maintained to City specifications.
- Section 6. Assessments by Master Association. Pursuant to the Master Declaration and the governing documents of the Master Association, the Master Association may also levy assessments against the Property for purposes including but not limited to maintenance, repair and upkeep of common areas and facilities which are common to and benefit the entire Stucki Farms community. Such assessments shall be levied and collected as set forth in the Master Declaration and the Master Association governing documents, but the Association may, pursuant to arrangements with the Master Association, collect the Master Association assessments and forward the same to the Master Association.
- Section 7. Collection of Assessments. No action shall be brought to enforce any assessment lien herein, unless at least sixty (60) days have expired following the later of: (a) the date a notice of default or notice of delinquent assessment is recorded; or (b) the date the recorded notice of default or notice of delinquent assessment is mailed in the United States mail, certified or registered, return receipt requested, to the Owner of the Unit. Such notice of default or notice of delinquent assessment must recite the legal description of such Unit, the record Owner or reputed Owner thereof, the amount claimed (which may, at the Association's option, include interest on the unpaid assessments, plus reasonable attorneys' fees and expenses of collection in connection with the debt secured by such lien), the name and address of the Association, and the name and address of the Trustee authorized by the Association to enforce the lien by sale. The notice of default and election to sell shall be signed and acknowledged by an Association officer, property manager, or Trustee designated by the Association for such purpose. The lien shall continue until fully paid or otherwise satisfied.

Section 8. Foreclosure Sale. Declarant hereby conveys and warrants pursuant to Utah Code Sections 57-1-20 and 57-8a-302 to attorney Matthew J. Ence, as Trustee, with power of sale, each Unit and all improvements to the Unit for the purpose of securing payment of assessments under the terms of this Declaration. The Association may from time to time appoint a substitute trustee by recording of a substitution of trustee as provided by applicable law. Any foreclosure sale shall be conducted by the appointed Trustee consistent with the provisions of Title 57, Chapter 1 of the Utah Code governing the exercise of powers of sale in Mortgages and Deeds of Trust, as amended, or in accordance with any similar statute hereafter enacted applicable to the exercise of powers of sale in Mortgages and Deeds of Trust, or in any other manner permitted by law. The Association, through its duly authorized agents, shall have the power to bid on the Unit at the foreclosure sale and to acquire and hold, lease, mortgage, and convey the same. Notices of default shall be provided as required by Utah Code § 57-1-24, as amended; a notice of delinquent assessment, if complying with the requirements of this Article, may serve the same purpose. Notice of time and place of sale shall be provided as required by Utah Code § 57-1-25, as amended.

ARTICLE IV OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE

Section 1. Maintenance by the Association. All areas maintained by the Association shall be maintained so as not to detract from the appearance of the Property and so as not to affect adversely the value or use of any Unit. The Association shall maintain the exterior landscaping on all lots and Common Areas, including all grass, shrubs, plants, and trees. The Association shall also maintain, repair, set, and regulate all irrigation and sprinkler systems and shall have access to all such systems, including sprinkler timing devices and clocks.

Section 2. Maintenance by Owner. No Unit Owner shall be permitted to allow the accumulation of rubbish or other unsightly items on or around his Unit. In the event any Owner shall allow such an accumulation in a manner inconsistent with the terms of this Declaration as determined by the Board of Directors, the Association shall have the right to enter upon such Unit to clean up the Unit and exterior of the Living Unit. The cost of such clean up shall be added to and become part of the assessment to which such Unit is subject.

Section 3. <u>Utilities</u>. Each Unit Owner shall pay for all utility services which are separately billed or metered to individual Units, including water, sewer, garbage, electrical and telephone service as the same may be provided by the City of Washington or other party furnishing such service. The Board of Directors shall determine what additional utility services, if any, shall be included in the general utility services for which the Association will be responsible for payment as an Association debt.

Section 4. Rules and Regulations. The Association shall have authority to promulgate and enforce such reasonable rules, regulations and procedures as may be necessary or desirable to aid the Association in carrying out any of its functions or to ensure that the Property and the Common

Areas are maintained and used in a manner consistent with the interests of the Owners. The Association also has authority to adopt a schedule of monetary fines that may be imposed on Owners for the willful violation of rules that have been duly adopted and published by the Association.

ARTICLE V EASEMENTS

Section 1. Minor Encroachments. Each Unit, the Common Areas, Limited Common Areas, and all other Properties described in the Official Plat, shall be subject to an easement for encroachment created by construction, repair, shifting, settling or movement, and overhangs as designed or constructed by the Declarant, as well as for the installation of necessary items or appurtenances of the living unit including, but not limited to, patios, heating/cooling units, eaves, etc. A valid easement for said encroachment and for the maintenance of same, so long as it stands, shall and does exist.

Section 2. <u>Utilities Easements</u>. There is hereby granted and conveyed to the City of Washington, for the benefit of all public utility providers, their successors and assigns, a blanket easement upon, across, over and under all of the Common Areas, including Limited Common Areas, for ingress, egress, installation, replacing, repairing and maintaining all utilities at such location or locations as said entity deems appropriate. By virtue of this easement, it shall be expressly permissible for the providing electrical, cable television and/or telephone company to construct and maintain the necessary equipment on said property and to affix and maintain electrical, cable television and/or telephone wires, circuits and conduits on, across and under the Common Areas, including Limited Common Areas.

An easement is further granted to all police, fire protection, ambulance, trash collection and all similar persons to enter upon the streets and Common Areas, including Limited Common Areas, in the performance of their duties. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this Article, no sewers, electrical lines, water lines, or other utilities may be installed or relocated on said property except as (i) initially planned and approved by the Declarant, or thereafter approved by the Board of Directors, or (ii) as required by the City of Washington. Should any company furnishing a service conveyed by the general easement herein provided request a specific easement by separate recordable document, Declarant shall have the right to grant such easement on said property without conflicting with the terms hereof.

Section 3. Easements for Ingress and Egress and Landscaping Maintenance and Repair. An easement is hereby granted to the Association, its officers, agents, employees and to any management company selected by the Association to enter in or to cross over the Common Areas, including Limited Common Areas, and any Unit to perform the duties of maintenance and repair of the Unit, yard and landscape area, or Common Areas provided for herein.

Section 4. Easements by Declarant. Declarant reserves the right to enter upon, connect to, access, or otherwise make use of the streets, water lines, sewer lines, drainage lines, power lines and other utilities on the property in the process of developing new phases and/or adjacent properties.

ARTICLE VI USE RESTRICTIONS AND REQUIREMENTS

- Section 1. Residential Use. No Owner of any Unit shall occupy or use his Unit, or permit the same or any part thereof to be occupied or used for any purpose other than as a private residence for the Owner and the Owner's family or the Owner's lessees or guests. Said restriction shall be limited to those properties meeting the definition of "Unit" herein.
- Section 2. Use of Units as Short-term Rentals. Owners may rent their Units as Short-term Rentals, subject to the requirements of this Declaration. "Short-term Rental" means a Unit used for resort or other transient lodging uses where the term of occupancy, possession, or tenancy of the Unit is for twenty-nine (29) consecutive calendar days or less, for direct or indirect remuneration. Owners opting to rent their Units as Short-term rentals are required to use the services of a property management company that is (a) licensed in accordance with state law and local ordinances and (b) approved by the Declarant. The Owner of a Short-term Rental shall, at all times the Unit is so rented, assure compliance of its tenants with: (a) any Master Declaration to which the Unit is subject, (b) this Declaration, (c) the governing documents of the Association, and (d) any rules and regulations for the Property.
- Section 3. Declarant's Right to Regulate Short-term Rentals. Declarant shall have the right to establish the procedures, rules, and regulations specific to Short-term Rentals, including check-in, access of short-term tenants to Units and common amenities and facilities, and so on. Declarant's right, or the right of Declarant's successor to its rights as Declarant hereunder, to approve a property management company or companies as set forth in the prior section, or to establish procedures, rules, and regulations for Short-term Rentals upon the Property as set forth in this section, shall not terminate at the end of the Declarant Control Period, but shall continue until Declarant voluntarily surrenders such rights in writing. In the event that Declarant, or Declarant's successor, surrenders or fails to exercise any of the rights set forth in this Section, the Association shall have the right to exercise said rights in Declarant's stead.

- Section 4. Owner's Right Not to Use as Short-term Rental. Each Owner shall have the right not to use the Owner's Unit as a Short-term Rental. In the event that an Owner elects not to use a Unit as a Short-term Rental, then the Owner is requested to complete and sign the form attached hereto as Exhibit "B", and provide the same to an officer of the Association. The filing of the form with the Association shall be a prerequisite of an Owner being released from any obligation to pay fees related to use of amenities provided for short-term rental tenants, and commits the Owner not to use the Unit for short-term rental purposes, and not to utilize the amenities provided for short-term rental users, without the payment of appropriate fees for such use. The form shall only be valid with respect to the Owner signing it, and shall not apply to any subsequent Owners of the same Unit, so each new Owner desiring to be excluded from applicable fees shall be required to complete and deliver to the Association a new form.
- Section 5. <u>Timeshares Prohibited</u>. No Owner shall offer or sell any interest in his Unit under a "timesharing" or "interval ownership" plan. This prohibition on timeshares does not include Short-term Rentals as provided for in this Declaration.
- <u>Section 6.</u> <u>Fee Conveyed.</u> Each Unit and all other Properties described on the Official Plat shall be conveyed as a separately designated and legally described freehold estate, the Owner taking title in fee simple, subject to the terms, conditions, and provisions hereof.

ARTICLE VII GENERAL PROVISIONS

- Section 1. Enforcement. The Association, or Declarant or its successors in interest, or any Owner shall have the right to sue for damages, or to enforce by any proceeding injunctive or otherwise, at law or in equity, all restrictions, conditions, covenants, reservations, liens and charges now or hereafter imposed by the provisions of this Declaration, Bylaws, or Articles of Incorporation. Specifically, the aggrieved party may seek to recover damages and for injunctive relief. Failure by the Association to enforce any covenant or restriction therein contained shall in no event be deemed a waiver of the right to do so thereafter. The prevailing party to any action brought to enforce the terms of this Declaration or any supplements or amendments thereto shall be entitled to costs and reasonable attorney fees.
- Section 2. Severability, Construction and Validity of Restrictions. All of said conditions, covenants and restrictions contained in this Declaration shall be construed together, but if it shall at any time be held that any one of said conditions, covenants or restrictions, or any part thereof, is invalid, or for any reason becomes unenforceable, no other condition, covenant or restriction, or any part thereof, shall be thereby affected or impaired; and Declarant and Unit Owners, their successors, heirs or assigns shall be bound by each article, section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause and phrase of this Declaration irrespective of the fact that any article, section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase be declared invalid or inoperative or for any reason become unenforceable.

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- Section 3. Duration. The covenants, conditions and restrictions of this Declaration shall run with and bind the land, and shall inure to the benefit of and be enforceable by the Association, or the Owner of any Unit subject to this Declaration, their respective legal representative, heirs, successors, and assigns for a term of thirty (30) years from the date this Declaration is recorded, after which time said covenants, conditions and restrictions shall be automatically extended for successive periods of ten (10) years.
- Section 4. Gender and Grammar. The singular wherever used in this Declaration shall be construed to mean the plural when applicable and the necessary grammatical changes required to make the provisions hereof apply either to corporations or individuals, men or women, shall in all cases be assumed as though in each case fully expressed.
- Section 5. Conflicts. In case of any conflict between this Declaration, as the same may be amended from time to time, and the Articles of Incorporation and the Bylaws of the Association, as they may be amended from time to time, the provisions of this Declaration shall be controlling.

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ARTICLE VIII AMENDMENT

The Declarant may unilaterally amend or modify this Declaration at any time during the Declarant Control Period. In addition to Declarant's right, this Declaration may be amended by an instrument signed by not less than two-thirds (2/3) of the Unit Owners, which amendment shall be effective upon recordation in the Office of the Recorder of Washington County, State of Utah. Prior to any material amendment to this Declaration, written notice shall be sent to all holders of first mortgage liens, setting forth said amendment and advising them of the date that the Members will vote on said amendment.
