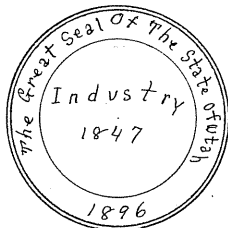

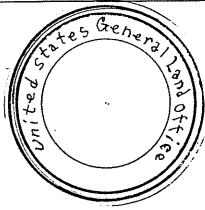
To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:
Whereas There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate Of The Register Of The Land Office at Salt Lake City Utah Territory, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain", and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Henry C. Fisher has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the North East quarter of Section twenty seven in Township four South of Range one West of Salt Lake Meridian in Utah Territory containing one hundred and sixty acres according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now know ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said Henry C. Fisher the tract of Land above described: To have and to hold the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Henry C. Fisher and to his heirs and assigns forever;
