

### Horn Silver Mining Company

A meeting of the Board of Directors of the Horn Silver Mining Company was held, pursuant to due notice, at the office of the Company, at Room 312, 176 Battery Place, New York City, on Thursday, October 10th, 1907.

The President stated that upon his recent visit to Salt Lake, he had learned that the property known as the "Franklyn Smelter" was no longer available for smelting purposes, because of the issue of a permanent injunction by the Federal Court of that District enjoining the smelting in that locality of ores carrying more than ten per cent sulphur. The injunction originally issued was temporary, but subsequently was made permanent because of the proof submitted by the agricultural interests of that section proving considerable damage to crops by smoke and fumes from smelting plants at Murray and its vicinity.

The President further stated that it was practicable to dispose of the property and asked that himself and the General Manager be given authority to negotiate for its sale. Thereupon on motion of Mr. Woolverton, seconded by Mr. Moore, it was

Resolved: That the President and General Manager of this Company be authorized and they hereby are authorized to dispose of the property known

as the "Franklyn Smelter" at the best obtainable price."


