The United States of America.

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, by the Act of Congress approved July 1, 1862, as amended by the Act of July 2, 1864, "to aid in the construction of a railroad and telegraph line from the Missouri River to the Pacific Ocean, and to secure to the Government the use of the same for postal, military and other purposes" and the Act of July 3, 1866, authority is given to the Central Pacific Railroad Company, to construct a railroad and telegraph line under certain conditions and regulations, as expressed in said Acts, and provision is made for granting to the said Company every alternate section of public land designated by odd numbers to the

amount of ten alternate sections per mile on each side of the said railroad on the line thereof and within the limits of twenty miles on each side of said road not sold reserved or otherwise disposed of by the United States and to which a pre-emption or homestead claim may not have attached at the time the line of said road is definitely fixed.

and whereas an official statement bearing date November 3 1869 from the Secretary of the Interior has been filed in this office showing that the line of said railroad and telegraph from Ogden in the Territory of Utah to Sacramento City State of California has been constructed and fully completed and equipped in the manner prescribed by the acts aforesaid.

and whereas certain tracts of land in the State of Utah have been listed under the acts aforesaid by the duly authorized land agent of said Central Pacific Railroad Company as shown by his original lists approved by the local land officers and on file in this office.

and whereas the said tracts of land lie contiguous to the constructed line of road and are particularly described as follows to-wit:

Township Seven Range One.

The South West quarter of section one containing one hundred and fifty-nine acres and eighty hundredths of an acre. The lot numbered five the North East quarter and the East half of the South East quarter of section seven containing two hundred and seventy-nine acres and ninety-two hundredths of an acre. all of section eleven containing six hundred and forty acres. all of section thirteen containing six hundred and forty acres. The South half of section fifteen containing three hundred and twenty acres. The North East quarter the North half of the North West quarter and the North East quarter of the South East quarter of section seventeen containing two hundred and eighty acres. all of section twenty-three containing six hundred and forty acres. The lots numbered three and four and the North East quarter of section twenty-seven containing two hundred and thirty-nine acres and eighty hundredths of an acre.

Township Six Range Two.

The North East quarter of section three containing one hundred and fifty-nine acres and forty-one hundredths of an acre. The lots numbered three and four of section five containing seventy-nine acres and twenty-five hundredths of an acre.

Township Seven Range Two.

The lots numbered one and two of the North West quarter of section thirty-one containing seventy-eight acres and thirty-two hundredths of an acre. The East half of the South East quarter of section

thirty-three containing eighty acres.

Township Six. Range Three.

The South East quarter of section one containing one hundred and sixty acres.

The said tracts of land as described in the foregoing make the aggregate area of (3,756.50) three thousand seven hundred and fifty-six acres and fifty hundredths of an acre.

Now Know ye, that the United States of America, in consideration of the premises and pursuant to the said acts of Congress, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Central Pacific Railroad Company, and to its assigns the tracts of land, listed as aforesaid and described in the foregoing yet excluding and excepting from the transfer by these presents, all mineral lands, should any such be found to exist in the tracts described in the foregoing, but this exclusion and exception according to the terms of the statute shall not be construed to include coal and iron lands.

To Have and to Hold the said tracts with the appurtenances thereof unto the said Central Pacific Railroad Company and to its successors and assigns forever.
