Whereas, Alma Eldredge, Mayor of the town of Coalville, in Summit County, Utah Territory in trust for the several use and benefit of the inhabitants of the said town of Coalville, in said County and Territory, according to their respective interests by virtue of the Act of March 2nd 1867, entitled an Act of the Relief of the inhabitants of Cities and towns upon the Public Lands, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Salt Lake City, Utah Territory whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Alma Eldredge, Mayor as aforesaid, in trust as aforesaid, according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April 1860, entitled "An Act making further provisions for the sale of the Public Lands," and the acts supplemental thereto: For the South half of the North east quarter and the South east quarter of Section eight, the South half of the North west quarter, and the South west quarter of Section five, the east half of the North east quarter of Section seventeen, and the West half of the North west quarter of Section sixteen in Township Two North of Range Five East, in the district of lands subject to sale, at Salt Lake City, Utah Territory, containing six hundred and forty acres, according to the official plat of the survey of said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said Tract has been purchased by the said Alma Eldredge Mayor as aforesaid, in trust as aforesaid.

Now Know ye, That the United States of America in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Alma Eldredge, Mayor as aforesaid, in trust as aforesaid, and to his successors the said Tract above described. To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging unto the said Alma Eldredge, Mayor as aforesaid, in trust as aforesaid, and to his successors, and assigns, in trust as aforesaid. Provided: That no title shall be hereby acquired to any mine of gold, silver, copper, or to any other mining claim or possession held

under existing laws, and provided further, that the grant hereby made is held and declared to be subject to all the conditions, limitations and restrictions, contained in Section two thousand three hundred and eighty six of the Revised Statutes of the United States so far as the same are applicable thereto.
