John Milner and Caroline Milner, his wife, Grantors of Summit County, Utah, hereby conveys and warrants to Utah Power & Light Company, a corporation, its successors in interest and assigns, Grantee, for the sum of One (\$1.00) Dollar and other valuable consideration, a perpetual easement and right of way for the erection and continued maintenance, repair, alteration, and replacement of the electric transmission, distribution and telephone circuits of the Grantee, and 2 poles, with the necessary guys, stubs, cross-arms and other attachments thereon, or affixed thereto, for the support of said circuits, to be erected and maintained upon and across the premises of the Grantor's in Summit County, Utah, along a line described as follows:

Commencing on west boundary of Grantor's land 740 feet east and 655 feet south of N.W. corner Sec. 24, Tp. 1 S. R. 5 E., S.L.M., thence running N. 83°23' E. 730 feet to east boundary of same.

Together with all rights of ingress and egress necessary or convenient for the full and complete use, occupation and enjoyment of the easement hereby granted, and all rights and privileges incident thereto, including the right to cut and remove timber, trees, brush, overhanging branches and other obstructions which may injure or interfere with the Grantee's use, occupation or enjoyment of this easement.
