The United States of America, To all to whom these presents shall come Greeting:

Whereas, by the Act of Congress approved July 1, 1862 July 2, 1864, July 3, 1866, joint resolution of July 26, 1866, and April 10, 1869, and the acts of May 6, 1870 to aid in the construction of a railroad and telegraph line from the Missouri River to the Pacific Ocean and to secure to the Government the use of the same for postal, military, and other purposes; authority is given to the Union Pacific Railroad Company, to construct a railroad and telegraph line, under certain conditions and stipulations as expressed in said acts, and provision is made for granting to the said company,

every alternate section of public land designated by odd numbers, to the amount of ten alternate sections per mile on each side of the said railroad, on the line thereof, and on each side of the said railroad, on the line thereof, and within the limits of twenty miles on each side of said road, not sold, reserved, or otherwise disposed of by the United States, and to which a Preemption or Homestead claim may not have attached at the time the line of said road is definitely fixed;

And Whereas, an official statement bearing date November 3, 1869, from the Secretary of the Interior, has been filed in the General Land Office, showing that the Commissioners appointed by the President, under provisions of the sixth section of said act of Congress approved July 2, 1864, have reported to him that the line of railroad and telegraph from Omaha, in the State of Nebraska, westward to Ogden, in the Territory of Utah, and known as the Union Pacific Rail Road, has been constructed and fully completed and equipped in the manner prescribed by the acts of Congress relative to the Pacific Railroad and Telegraph line; and the Union Pacific Railway Company, formerly the Union Pacific Railroad Company, has applied for a conveyance of the title to the lands granted to said company by the said acts of Congress of July 1, 1862, and July 2, 1864:

And Whereas certain tracts have been selected under the acts aforesaid, by Leavitt Burnham, the duly authorized Land Agent of the Union Pacific Railway Company, formerly the Union Pacific Railroad Company, as shown by his original list of selections dated May 24, 1881, certified under date of May 27, 1881, by the Register and Receiver at Salt Lake City, Utah Territory, the said tract of land being coterminous to the constructed line of road and are particularly described as follows to wit:

North of base line and West of Salt Lake Principal Meridian, Utah Territory.

Township one, Range one.

The North East quarter of the South East quarter of Section one, containing forty acres. The South West quarter of the North West quarter, the West half of the South West quarter, and the South East quarter of the South West quarter of Section three, containing one hundred and sixty acres.

The North West quarter of the North East quarter, the North East quarter of the North West quarter, the South West quarter, and the North West quarter of the South East quarter of Section twenty one, containing two hundred and eighty acres. The North West quarter, the North East quarter of the South West quarter, and the South East quarter of Section twenty three, containing three hundred and sixty acres. The South East quarter of Section twenty seven, containing one hundred and sixty acres. The East half of the North West quarter, the East half of the South West quarter, and the East half of section twenty nine, containing four hundred and eighty acres. The North East quarter of Section thirty three, containing one hundred and sixty acres. The North East quarter, and the West half of section thirty five, containing four hundred and eighty acres.

Township Five, Range Two.

The West half of the North West quarter of Section twenty nine, containing eighty acres. The South half of the South West quarter, (or the South East quarter of the South West quarter, and the lot numbered four) of Section thirty one, containing eighty acres and nineteen one hundredths of an acre.

Township Six, Range Two.

The North half of the North East quarter, the South East quarter of the North East quarter, the North West quarter, the South half of the South West quarter, the North East quarter of the South East quarter, and the South half of the

South East quarter of section seven, containing four hundred and seventy five acres and forty seven one hundredths of an acre. The South half of the South East quarter, and the South West quarter of the South East quarter of section nine, containing one hundred and twenty acres. The South half of the South West quarter, and the North half of the North West quarter of section fifteen, containing one hundred and sixty acres. The South East quarter, and the West half of section seventeen, containing four hundred and eighty acres. All of section nineteen, containing six hundred and thirty five acres and sixty four one hundredths of an acre.

Township Seven, Range Two.

The West half of the South West quarter, and the South East quarter of the South West quarter of section thirty-one, containing one hundred and nineteen acres and eighty seven one hundredths of an acre.

Township Four, Range Three.

The 1st numbered two of the North West quarter, the North East quarter of the South West quarter, and the 1st numbered three of the South West quarter of section thirty-one, containing one hundred and twenty acres.

Township One, Range Five.

The North East quarter of the North East quarter, and the South half of the South West quarter of section nine, containing one hundred and twenty acres. The South half of the North East quarter, and the South East quarter of section seventeen, containing two hundred and forty acres. The South West quarter of the South East quarter, and the South half of the South West quarter of section twenty-nine, containing one hundred and twenty acres. The South half of the South West quarter, and the North West quarter of the South East quarter of section thirty-one, containing one hundred and twenty acres and six one hundredths of an acre. The West half of the North West quarter of section thirty-three, containing eighty acres.

Township Two, Range Five.

The South West quarter of the North East quarter, the South half of the North West quarter, and the North West quarter of the South West quarter of section eleven, containing one hundred and sixty acres. The South West quarter, and the West half of the South East quarter of section twenty-one, containing two hundred and forty acres. The North East quarter of the South East quarter of section twenty-nine, containing

forty acres. The North West quarter of the North East quarter, and the East half of the North West quarter of section thirty-three, containing one hundred and twenty acres.

Township Two, Range Six.

The West half of the South East quarter of section five, containing eighty acres.

South of base line and East of Salt Lake Principal Meridian, Utah Territory.

Township One, Range Three.

The North West quarter of the North East quarter, and the North East quarter of the North West quarter of section thirteen thirteen, containing eighty acres.

Township One, Range Four.

The East half of the South East quarter of section seven, containing eighty acres. The North East quarter of section twenty one, containing one hundred and sixty acres.

Township One, Range Five.

The North half of the North East quarter, and the South East quarter of the North East quarter of section fifteen, containing one hundred and twenty acres. The South half of the South East quarter, and the South East quarter of the South West quarter of section twenty five, containing one hundred and twenty acres.

Township One, Range Six.

The South East quarter of section nineteen, containing one hundred and sixty acres. The North West quarter of section thirty one, containing one hundred and fifty nine acres and eighty eight one hundredths of an acre.

The said tracts of land as described in the foregoing make the aggregate area of (11,230.93) eleven thousand two hundred and thirty acres and ninety three one hundredths of an acre.

Now Know Ye, that the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and pursuant to the said act of Congress. Have Given and Granted, and by these presents Do Give and Grant unto the said Union Pacific Railway Company, formerly the Union Pacific Railroad Company, and to its assigns the tracts of land selected as aforesaid and described in the foregoing yet excluding and excepting from the transfer by presents, "All mineral lands," should any such be found to exist in the tracts described in the foreg-

this exclusion and exception according to the terms of the Statute, shall not be construed to include coal and iron land;

To Have and To Hold the said tracts with the appurtenances unto the said Union Pacific Railway Company, and to its assigns forever, with the exclusion and exception as aforesaid.
