Hyrum J. Newton and Florence E. Newton, his wife, Grantors, of Salt Lake County, Utah, hereby convey and warrant to UTAH POWER & LIGHT COMPANY, a corporation, its successors in interest and assigns, Grantee, for the sum of One (\$1.00) Dollar and other valuable consideration, a perpetual easement and right of way for the erection and continued maintenance, repair, alteration, and replacement of the Electric transmission, distribution and telephone circuits of the Grantee, and 2 guy anchors and 4 poles, with the necessary guys, stubs, crossarms and other attachments thereon, or affixed thereto, for the support of said circuits to be erected and maintained upon and across the premises of the Grantors in Summit County, Utah, along a line described as follows:

Beginning on west boundary line of Grantor's land at a point 1340 feet south and 1320 feet west, more or less, from the northeast corner of Section 4, T. 2 N. R. 7 E. S.L.B.&M. thence running S. 76°36' E. 1375 feet, more or less, to fence on east boundary line of said land; also beginning on Grantor's land at a point 1465 feet south and 820 feet west, more or less, from the northeast corner of said Section 4, thence running S. 38°12' W. 295 feet, more or less, on said land; and being in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 4.

Together with all rights of ingress and egress necessary or convenient for the full and complete use occupation and enjoyment of the easement hereby granted, and all rights and privileges incident thereto, including the right to cut and remove timber, trees, brush, overhanging branches and other obstructions which may injure or interfere with the Grantee's use occupation, or enjoyment of this easement.

Powell, his wife, Grantors of Summit County, Utah, hereby convey and warrant to UTAH POWER & LIGHT COMPANY, a corporation, its successors in interest and assigns, Grantee, for the sum of One (\$1.00) Dollar and other valuable consideration, a perpetual easement and right of way for the erection and continued maintenance, repair, alteration, and replacement of the electric transmission, distribution and telephone circuits of the Grantee, and 1 guy anchor and 8 poles with the necessary guys, stubs, crossarms and other attachments thereon, or affixed thereto, for the support of said circuits, to be erected and maintained upon and across the premises of the Grantors, in Summit County, Utah, along a line described as follows:

Beginning at fence on west boundary line of Grantor's land at a point 1660 feet south, more or less, from the northwest corner of Section 3, T. 2 N. R. 7 E. S.L.B.&M. thence running S. 76°36' E. 780 feet, thence S. 83°55' E. 1840 feet, more or less, to east boundary line of said land and being in the S $\frac{1}{2}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 3.

Together with all rights of ingress and egress necessary or convenient for the full and complete use, occupation and enjoyment of the easement, hereby granted, and all rights and privileges incident thereto, including the right to cut and remove timber, trees, brush, overhanging branches and other obstructions which may injure or interfere with the Grantee's use, occupation, or enjoyment of this easement.
