Yolle, according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled, "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," and the acts supplemental thereto, for the north half of the north west quarter, the south east quarter of the north west quarter, the north east quarter of the south east quarter, the north half of the south east quarter, and the north east quarter of section twenty-four in Township Thirteen, south of range eighty-four west of the eighth Principal Meridian in Colorado containing four hundred acres.




