Yelle according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled, "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," and the acts supplemental thereto, for the north half of the north west quarter the south east quarter of the north west quarter the north east quarter of the south west quarter the north half of the south east quarter and the north east quarter of section Twenty four in Township nineteen south of range sixty four west of the sixth Principal Meridian in Colorado containing four hundred acres

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said Tract has been purchased by the said Emanuel C. Yelle

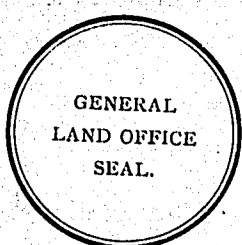
