

Right of Way Easement.

Ford Brothers Land and Live Stock Co., a corporation, organized under the laws of the State of Utah, of Orderville, County of Garfield, State of Utah, grantors for one dollar and other valuable considerations, with by the Utah Power & Light Company, grantee, receipts of which is hereby acknowledged, hereby grants, warrants, and sells to the Utah Power and Light Co., its successors and assigns, a right of way and the right, privilege and authority to construct and operate and maintain a line for the purpose of transmitting electric power and telegraph and telephone wires over and across a piece of land (No. 1) which is now and is well situated in the County of Big Horn and State of Utah and more particularly described as follows to wit: Beginning at a point 446 feet South and $88^{\circ}3'6''$ East distance of 508 feet from the Section corner between Sections 26 & 27, 5 N. 1 E. 21 & 22, R. 14, and running thence $S. 88^{\circ}3'6''$ East distance of 1565 feet, more or less.

2nd Beginning at a point 27' 6" distance of 340 feet from the corner of Section 26, 5 N. 1 E. 21 & 22, R. 14, and running thence $S. 88^{\circ}3'6''$ East distance of 8110 feet more or less.

Together with all the rights to grantor, its successors and assigns, to place and relocate, inspect and operate thereon poles, crossarms and fixtures, and to place and maintain such other appurtenances as may be necessary to operate said line, and string wires and cables, from time to time, across, over or under the above described premises; (However, as to the number of poles to be placed upon said land hereinafter, it is understood and agreed that only 8 poles shall be placed upon said land under this agreement for the above consideration; but if at any time the grantee shall desire to erect and maintain additional poles upon said land it may do so under this easement by paying to the then owner of said land the further sum of \$50.00 for each pole so placed and maintained, such payment to be made at the time such pole is erected; also the right and privilege to cut and remove from said premises and on either side thereof any timber trees or overhanging branches or other obstruction that do or may endanger the safety or interfere with the use of said poles or fixtures or wires thereon attached and the right of ingress and egress to and over the above
