

BOARD OF CANVASSERS

The Board of County Commissioners of Weber County, State of Utah, met pursuant to Chapter 17, Session Laws of Utah, 1945, at 10:30 A. M., on Thursday, July 19th, 1945, in the session room of the County Commissioners in the City and County Building, as a Board of Canvassers.

Commissioner Simmons moved that Commissioner Hess act as Chairman of the meeting. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Petersen, and carried.

Mr. Lawrence M. Malan, County Clerk, informed the Board that returns had been received from Plain City District in Weber County, of the election held on Tuesday, July 17th, 1945, for the organization of the Plain City Cemetery District.

Mr. Malan produced before the Board the returns received by him from the Judges of Election in and for the district as required by Chapter 17, Session Laws of Utah, 1945, and stated that he had checked the registration books for Plain City, there are 407 legal registered voters, less 97 non property owners, leaving a total of 310 legal registered voting taxpayers.

The Board proceeded to canvass the votes cast at the election.

The canvass of the returns having been completed, it is hereby unanimously declared that the following is a full, true and correct statement as to the election:

WHEREUPON, on motion of Commissioner Simmons it was unanimously ordered that as it appears from the canvass that more than one-half of all the qualified voters in said district who shall have paid a property tax in such district in the year next preceding the election, have voted in favor of the organization of the PLAIN CITY CEMETERY DISTRICT, covering the following territory.

The South four and thirty eight hundredths (4.38) chains of Section Fifteen (15); the South two hundred eighty eight and seven tenths (288.7) feet of Section Sixteen (16), and Seventeen (17); and the East half of the South two hundred eighty eight and seven tenths (288.7) feet of Section Eighteen (18), and all of Sections Twenty (20), Twenty one (21), Twenty two (22), Twenty seven (27), Twenty eight (28), Twenty nine (29), Thirty two (32), Thirty three (33), Thirty four (34), and the East half of Section Thirty (30), also the East one half of Sections 19 and 31, all in Township Seven North of Range two West, Salt Lake Meridian and Base.

Also the North half of Section Three (3) and the North half of Section Four (4), and the Southwest quarter of Section Four (4), lying north of the Warren Canal, and all of Section Five (5) North of the Weber River, and the North half of the Northeast Quarter of Section Six (6) all in Township Six (6) North, of Range Two West, Salt Lake Meridian.

The said district to be divided into three subdivisions to be known as Cemetery Maintenance Commissioners Subdistricts, One, Two and Three, as follows:

All of the Plain City Cemetery District from its northern boundary to the southern boundary being and lying west of a line or projection north and south thereof, between Blocks Two, Five, Eight, Eleven, Fourteen, Seventeen and Twenty, and Three, Four, Nine, Ten, Fifteen, Sixteen and Twenty one, in Plat A, Plain City Survey, Weber County, shall be known as Cemetery Maintenance Commissioners District Number One, being part of Sections 19, 20, 21, 29, 31 and 32, in Township 7 North, Range 2 West, Salt Lake Meridian, United States Survey, also part of Sections 5 and 6, Township 6 North, Range 2 West, Salt Lake Meridian, United States Survey.

All north of a line between Blocks Seven, Eight and Nine and Ten, Eleven, Twelve or Projection east and west thereof, lying east of Cemetery Maintenance Commissioners District Number One, shall be known as Cemetery Maintenance Commissioners District Number Two, being all of Sections 21, 22, 27, 28 and part of Sections 32, 33 and 34, all in Township 7 North, Range 2 West, Salt Lake Meridian, United States Survey.

That portion of the Plain City Cemetery District lying and being east of Cemetery Maintenance Commissioners District Number One, and South of Cemetery Maintenance Commissioners District Number Two, shall be known as Cemetery Maintenance Commissioners District Number Three, being part of Sections 32, 33 and 34, Township 7 North, Range 2 West, Salt Lake Meridian, United States Survey, and part of Sections 3, 4 and 5, Township 6 North, Range 2 West, Salt Lake Meridian, United States Survey,

and that the following be recommended to the Governor of the State of Utah, as the first Commissioners of said subdistricts:

Albert Sharp, District Number One
Floyd Palmer, District Number Two
Charles Heslop, District Number Three

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Petersen and unanimously carried all voting aye.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.
