# The United States of America,

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS. In pursuance of the provisions of the Revised Statutes of the United States, Chapter Six, Title Thirty-two, and legislation supplemental thereto, there have been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States the Plat and Field Notes of Survey and the Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Salt Lake City, Utah, accompanied by other evidence whereby it appears that the Utah Granite and Marble Company

has entered and paid for the Wasatch No. 14 placer mining claim,

designated by the Surveyor General as Survey No. 6774 embracing a portion of Township three south of Range two east of the Salt Lake Meridian, in the Little Cottonwood Mining District, Salt Lake County, Utah,

and bounded, described, and platted as follows: Beginning at corner No. 1, an iron pipe two inches in diameter, three and one-half feet long, marked 1 - 6774, in mound of earth and stones, from which U.S. Mineral Monument No. 247, bears north eighty-one degrees forty minutes east two thousand two hundred seventy-eight and five-tenths feet distant;

Thence, first course, north one thousand three hundred twenty feet to corner No. 2, an iron pipe one and one-half inches in diameter, four feet long, marked 2 - 6774, in mound of earth and stones;

Thence, second course, west three thousand nine hundred sixty feet to corner No. 3, an iron pipe, two inches in diameter, four feet long, marked 3 - 6774, in mound of earth and stones;

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Thence, third course, south one thousand six hundred thirty-one and five-tenths feet to witness corner to corner No. 4, lead pipe five-eighths of an inch in diameter, twenty-eight inches long, marked W.C. 4 - 6774; one thousand nine hundred eighty feet to corner No. 4, on steep slope and not established;

Thence, fourth course, east one thousand three hundred twenty feet to corner No. 5, on steep slope and not established;

Thence, fifth course, north four hundred twenty-seven and three tenths feet to witness corner to said corner No. 5, an iron pipe three-fourths of an inch in diameter, fourteen inches long, marked W.C. 5 - 6774; six hundred sixty feet to corner No. 6, an iron pipe two inches in diameter, three and five-tenths feet long, marked 6 - 6774, in mound of earth and stones;

Thence, sixth course, east two thousand six hundred forty feet to corner No. 1, the place of beginning; the premises herein granted, containing one hundred forty acres.

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NOW KNOW YE, That there is therefore, pursuant to the laws aforesaid, hereby granted by the United States unto the said **Utah Granite and Marble Company**

, the said placer mining premises hereinbefore described;

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD said mining premises, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said grantee above named and to **its successors** and assigns forever; subject nevertheless to the following conditions and stipulations:

FIRST. That the grant hereby made is restricted in its exterior limits to the boundaries of the said mining premises, and to any veins or lodes of quartz or other rock in place bearing gold, silver, cinnabar, lead, tin, copper, or other valuable deposits, which may have been discovered within said limits subsequent to and which were not known to exist on **April 18, 1925.**

SECOND. That should any vein or lode of quartz or other rock in place bearing gold, silver, cinnabar, lead, tin, copper, or other valuable deposits, be claimed or known to exist within the above-described premises at said last-named date, the same is expressly excepted and excluded from these presents.

THIRD. That the premises hereby conveyed shall be held subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local laws, customs, and decisions of the courts. And there is reserved from the lands hereby granted a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

FOURTH. That in the absence of necessary legislation by Congress, the Legislature of **Utah** may provide rules for working the mining claim or premises hereby granted, involving easements, drainage, and other necessary means to the complete development thereof.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I, **Calvin Coolidge,**

President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
