WHEREAS, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States evidence whereby it appears that Irvin Eaton is entitled to a patent for the Lot twelve of Block twenty-seven, the Lot one of Block thirty-nine and the Lot sixteen of Block forty in the Townsite of Duchesne, Utah, according to the approved Plat of the Survey of said Townsite on file in the General Land Office, containing eleven thousand two hundred fifty square feet:

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided, HAS GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DOES GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said Irvin Eaton the tract of land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Irvin Eaton, and to his heirs and assigns forever; subject to any vested and accured water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws, and decisions of courts.
