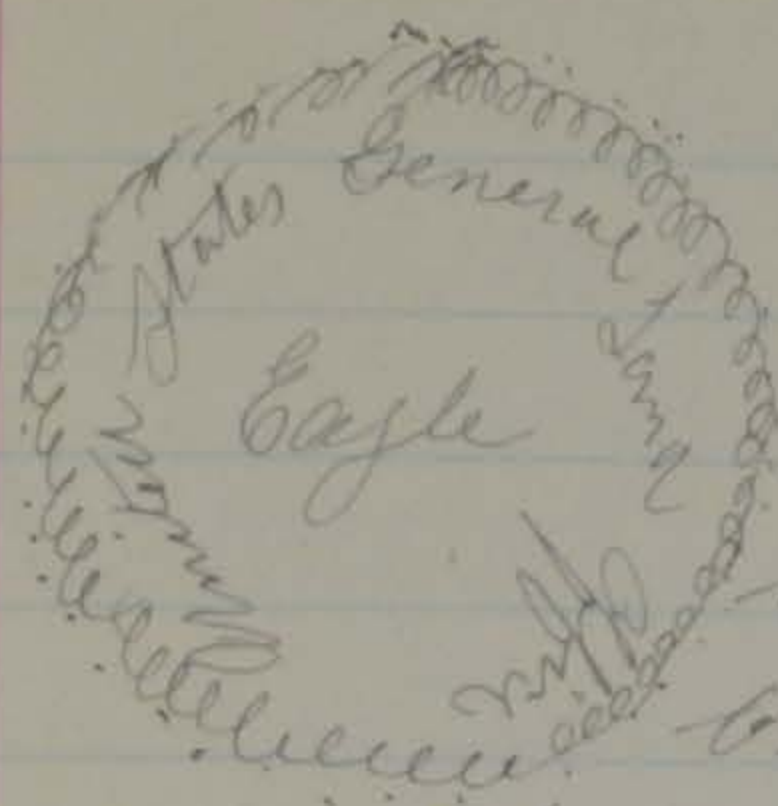

The United States of America.

To all to whom these Presents shall come Greeting:
Whereas, in pursuance of the Revised Statutes of the
United States, there has been deposited in the General
Land Office of the United States the Certificate of
the Register of the Land Office at Salt Lake City
in the Territory of Utah, whereby it appears that
Charles T. Tiernan did on the thirteenth day
of April, A.D. 1892. enter and pay for the East half
of the South East Quarter of section eight and
the west half of the South-west Quarter of
Section nine, in Township thirty-eight,
South of range eleven west, Salt Lake Meridian,
embracing one hundred and sixty acres of Land,
more or less, as shown by the Official plat of
the survey of said land returned to the
General Land Office by the Surveyor General.
The same being Coal Entry No 105 in the series
of said Office.

Now Know ye, That the United States of
America, in consideration of the promise,
and in conformity with said act of Congress,
have given and granted, and by these presents,
do give and grant, unto the said, Charles
T. Tiernan and to his heirs the said tracts
above described: To have and to hold the same
together with all the rights, privileges, immunities,
and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto
belonging, unto the said Charles T. Tiernan
and to his heirs and assigns forever; subject to

any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws, and decisions of courts, and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to extract and remove his ore therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted, as provided by law. And there is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

In testimony whereof I, Benjamin Harrison, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
