1855 } Whereas William C. Barker of Malheur County, Utah Territory, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Salt Lake City, Utah Territory, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said William C. Barker according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 20th of April 1850, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," of the acts supplemental thereto, for the lot numbered six of Section six in Township first North of Range one West in the district of lands subject to sale at Salt Lake City, Utah Territory, containing thirty nine acres, eighty seven hundredths of an acre, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said William C. Barker.

Now Know Ye That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said William C. Barker and to his heirs, the said tract above described, to have and to hold the same together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said William C. Barker and to his heirs and assigns forever, subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws, and decisions of courts, and also subject to the right of the proprietors of a vein or lode to extract and remove his ore therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted as provided by law.

In testimony Whereof, Rutherford B. Hayes, President of the United States of America, has caused these letters to be made public, of the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed. Given under my hand at the City of Washington, the twenty third day of July, the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and eighty five of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and fiftieth.

Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office, at Salt Lake City, Utah Territory, whereby it appears that pursuant to the Act of Congress, approved 20th May, 1862, "to secure Homesteads to actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of William C. Parker has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the South East Quarter of the North West Quarter of the Lot numbered 27 of Section 32 in Town ship 2 North of Range one West of Salt Lake Meridian, in Utah Territory, containing seventy nine acres and ninety two hundredths of an acre, according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General.

Now Know Ye that there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said William C. Parker the tract of land above described. To have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said William C. Parker and to his heirs and assigns forever, subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws and decisions of courts, and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to extract and remove his ore therefrom, should the same be found to penetrate or intersect the premises hereby granted, as provided by law.
