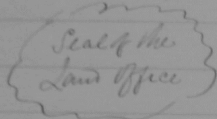

To, all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Salt Lake City Utah Territory, whereby it appears that pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May 1862 "To Secure Homesteads to actual Settlers, on the Public Domain", and the Acts Supplemental thereto, the claim of Joseph J. Clayton has been established, and duly consummated in conformity to Law, in the east half of the south east quarter of section fourteen, in township five, north of range two, west of Salt Lake Meridian in Utah Territory, containing eighty acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General.

Now know ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Joseph J. Clayton the tract of Land above described: to have, and to hold the said tract of land with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Joseph J. Clayton, and to his heirs, and assigns forever, subject to any vested, and accrued Water rights for Mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches, and reservoirs used in connection with such Water rights, as may be recognized and acknowledged, by the local Customs, laws, and decisions of Courts, and also subject to the right of the proprietor of a vein or lode to extract, and remove his ore therefrom should the same be found to

penetrate, or interest the premises hereby granted, as provided by law.

In testimony whereof I Chester A. Arthur, President of the United States of America have caused these letters to be made public, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed

This Deed, made this Seventh day of January in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty nine, between, Galen W. Blasingame of the county of Arapahoe, and state of Colorado, of the first part, and W. W. Gony, A. B. Gony, C. J. Gony, E. C. Watts, and W. H. Watts of the County of Weber, Utah Territory, of the second part - Witnesseth that the said parties of the first part for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty two hundred - 2200 - Dollars to the said parties of the first part in hand paid by the said parties of the second part, the receipt whereof is, ^{fully confessed and} acknowledged has granted, bargained sold, and conveyed, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell, convey and confirm, unto the said parties of the second part, their heirs and assigns forever, all the following described lot or parcel of land, situate, lying and being in the County of Weber in Utah Territory to wit:

A part of Lot nine - 9 - in Block Thirtien - 13 - Plat A' of Ogden City survey; beginning Twelve - 12 - feet south of the North East Corner of said Lot nine - 9 - running thence South Six - 6 - Rods thence West Thirtien, and half 13 1/2 Rods, thence North Six - 6 - Rods, thence East Thirtien, and one half - 13 1/2 - Rods to place of beginning with a perpetual right of way over a road way Twelve - 12 - feet wide, adjoining said land on the North - together with all and singular, the hereditaments and appurtenances therunto belonging, or in any wise appertaining, and the revenues and profits, remainders and remainder, rents issues, and profits thereof;
